Rhizome to Present Signature Seven on Seven Conference in London on October 27

Organized with the Barbican Centre, the Event Pairs Artists and Technologists in Teams to Develop a New Project in a Single Day

New York, NY...Following the fourth annual **Seven on Seven Conference** in New York this past spring, Rhizome, an affiliate organization in residence at the New Museum, is pleased to announce the program will expand internationally. **Rhizome** and the **Barbican Centre** will partner this October to present the **first London edition** of the acclaimed Seven on Seven Conference, an international event that brings together luminary figures at the forefront of art and technology to create innovative new projects in a single day.

Over the course of twenty-four hours, seven teams, each comprised of a leading artist and technologist, are challenged to work together to develop something new, be it an application, concept, artwork, product, or whatever they imagine. Each team will then present their project at the Conference on **Sunday October 27, 2013**, **from 12–6 p.m.**

Rhizome's Seven on Seven Conference is inspired by "9 Evenings," a legendary 1966 event organized by a group that would come to be known as E.A.T. (Experiments in Art and Technology), which paired visual artists, musicians, and dancers, from Robert Rauschenberg to John Cage and Yvonne Rainer, with scientists like Billy Klüver. The Conference has been a sell-out in New York City for the past four years, hosted with the New Museum. Previous participants in New York include Dennis Crowley (Foursquare founder), David Karp (Tumblr founder), and the late internet activist Aaron Swartz, along with artists Jill Magid, Ryan Trecartin, and Taryn Simon. The London edition aims to demonstrate the similarities between the two cities' art and technology scenes.

"This event underlines how much potential there is in developing new technologies in cities like London and New York, where entrepreneurs and developers necessarily rub up against culture and the arts," said Heather Corcoran, Executive Director of Rhizome. "From companies like TweetDeck, Sum.ly, and Last.fm in London, to Kickstarter, Foursquare, and MakerBot in New York, there are a growing number of success stories that we believe are a product of the interaction between art and technology."

Seven on Seven continues the Barbican's growing commitment to digital projects and celebrates its location in the heart of Tech City in London. The event will be held at Milton Court, a brand-new concert hall and state-of-the-art venue.

The full line-up of participants will be released on October 1, 2013. Tickets will be available for purchase online at barbican.org.uk starting on September 4.
