ON VIEW

This exhibition is the second in an ongoing series entitled ON VIEW, which presents work that has not yet received significant exposure in New York, or new work by better-known artists. Now encompassing The New Work Gallery, The Window on Broadway, and WorkSpace, this format allows us greater flexibility to show work without the usual two-year lead time necessitated by the organization of a major exhibition.

This current selection is not united by style or theme, but rather presents a range of interests and concerns. Sculptor Janet Pihlblad marbleizes found fragments of wood, which she then arranges, to suggest poses that recall classical sculptures. This juxtaposition sets up a dialogue between nature and art, and classical and modern sensibilities. Lance Rutledge, in his paintings, also suggests the human form by way of masklike shapes that appear to hover in barren, lunar landscapes. In the small, intimate black-and-white photographs of California artist Judy Fiskin, the people are present only by implication. In Some Aesthetic Decisions, Fiskin has photographed flower and plant arrangements and other setups at floral shows or private residences, all of which reveal personal choices about how people display things.

In the Broadway $\underline{\text{Window}}$, Robin Ticho has created a complex spatial arrangement onto which she projects a series of manipulated slides. The mirrors both engage the passing spectator and provide a real stand-in for the stenciled international symbols that are also a part of the window's complex imagery.

In <u>WorkSpace</u> is a sound/image installation by Barbara Ess, selected by Adjunct Curator Brian Wallis. This project in stereo constitutes both a literal and metaphorical interpretation of the Doppler Effect. This scientific principle distinguishes the symmetrical rise and fall in pitch as sound approaches and moves away from an observer. In this installation, sound "moves" across the space, between the poles established by two haunting photographs (<u>The Beast's Feet</u> and <u>Limbo</u>), creating a disturbing sense of passage from one state of existence to another.
