THE INVENTED LANDSCAPE, AN EXHIBITION OF THE WORK OF TEN CONTEMPORARY PHOTOGRAPHERS, OPENS FEBRUARY 17, 1979.

THE INVENTED LANDSCAPE, an exhibition of the work of ten contemporary photographers, opens at The New Museum Saturday, February 17, 1979, continuing through April 14, 1979.

In keeping with The New Museum's policy of showing diverse approaches to visual issues and themes, THE INVENTED LANDSCAPE explores contemporary alternatives to the traditional landscape photograph. This exhibition of experimental landscape photography has been organized for The New Museum by Christopher English, a Chicago photo-historian.

Rather than stressing the primacy of the natural scene, the work in the exhibition emphasizes the actions of the artist. It is a new, synthetic landscape that is presented, not a response to a pre-existing piece of nature. The exhibition presents a wide range of visual solutions to this problem, from highly manipulated prints incorporating drawing and handapplied color, to unaltered images that are non-traditional only through their distortions of conceptual categories.
