


OPEN HOUSE FOR SECURITY GUARDS AT THE NEW MUSEUM



Friday, October 2, 1992 6:00 - 8:00 PM

The New Museum of Contemporary Art is hosting a free evening for New York area Museum guards on Friday, October 2, 1992, 6:00 - 8:00 PM. This evening is being held in conjunction with an extraordinary education project in the Museum's current exhibition, *The Spatial Drive* (on view from September 27 through January 3, 1993). Instead of finding the standard written information, visitors can expect a different point of view. **No wall texts. No labels. No printed information at all.** If you want to know about the artists, their works, themes and intentions -- just ask the guards. **They know there is more to visiting a Museum than meets the eye.**

"The guards are the ones who have an energized on-going relationship with the art works. They grow on us six hours a day, five days a week," stresses Kimball Augustus, New Museum guard since 1977.

This project has been developed in collaboration with artist Laurie Parsons.

Funding for *The Spatial Drive* is provided by the National Endowment for the Arts, the New York Council on the Arts, and the New York City Department of Cultural Affairs.

The New Museum of Contemporary Art is located at **583 Broadway**, between Houston and Prince Streets on the West side of the street. By subway, take the No. 6 Lexington Ave. train to Spring or Bleecker; the N/R train to Prince; the A/C/E 8th Ave. train to Spring; B/D/Q/F 6th Ave. trains to Broadway/Lafayette. Buses #1/#5/#6/#21 to Houston or Broadway. Admission is free with Museum ID.
